AGAPE Needed for Upcoming Walks and Chrysalis Flights

Agape FAQ's

Making Agape can be a fun group, reunion group, Bible study or even date night activity. Ideas are endless and whether you are crafty or not there is always something you can provide! Here are some FAQ's concerning Agape.

Q: How many pieces of Agape do I need to make for an Emmaus Walk?

A: To cover the Conference Room (Inside) and Outside team (Angels) of a Men's OR Women's walk you need to provide 72 pieces. If you want to cover both walks, it takes 144 pieces.

Q: How many pieces of Agape do I need for a Chrysalis Flight?

A: 30 pieces.

Q: How should I label the Agape?

A: Agape should be labeled with an appropriate Bible verse or De Colores, then the name of the "group" or church group that provided it. No personal names.

Q: What is the latest date I should get the Agape to an Emmaus Walk.

A: Thursday at Send-off.

Q: What should I make?

A: Ideas are limitless, check out Pinterest, they have an Emmaus Agape Pin. You can also check out your local Christian bookstore or Oriental Trading Company.

So What Exactly is CHRYSALIS?

A Chrysalis Flight is an experience of Christian spiritual renewal and formation for young adults between 15 and 18. It begins with a three-day short course in Christianity and presents an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.


The Chrysalis experience begins with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete an application. The Chrysalis leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and in God's time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle.

Following the three-day experience, teen participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ. Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Chrysalis community, each participant's individual gifts

and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Chrysalis is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities and places of work. Chrysalis lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

Chrysalis is open to young adults and youth of any Christian denomination. It is for all those who desire to grow deeper in their relationship with God and others. Teens are invited to join your brothers and sisters in Christ for this three day experience of worship, prayer, fellowship, creative expression, singing, recreation, and discussion. My 4th Day Experience

What does your 'Prison' look like? Most of us have something that keeps us from going out into the world and living the life God HAD planned for us. Some of us are in a prison of fear, low self esteem, loneliness, insecurities, addictions, etc. The list can go on and on.

For me, my list of things that kept me imprisoned was so long I didn't even know what all of them were. I thought

that I had a strong relationship with Jesus; since I was a young girl we talked all the time. During a very volatile time in my life, when I was about 23, I experienced the Power of Prayer; it was the first of many miracles God showed me in my lifetime. He showed me that all that I believed in was real, that He was with me during this very tough, scary time in my life, even though there were many times in my life when I was not as faithful as I should have been.

This is how I lived my life for the next 27 years, just thinking that all I had to do was believe, be a good person, go to Church and I could live my life the way I wanted to, because Jesus would always be there for me. I went to Church, but I never read the bible. I would say the same prayers I learned as a child and I continued my private conversations with Him; I would say at that time that I was religious.

We moved to Texas in 2005 per God's plan. Of course, we joined the Church in town, joined our first bible study and our life started to change, for the better. The next thing I knew, I am being asked to go on this weekend called Emmaus. I had never heard of it before moving to Texas, but I reluctantly agreed to go and was curious to see what this Emmaus thing was all about.

It was during those 72 hours that I realized that being religious is not enough. Having a relationship with Jesus Christ is great, but I found that it was all one sided. It is what Joyce Meyers says, "What about Me, it's all about Me, Me, Me, Me!" I had never thought of what can I do for God; what does Jesus need me to do, where can I be a servant for Christ. It was during these 72 hours that I realized that I was in a self made prison of all the things that I allowed to rule my life.

On Friday night I had a vision of me inside a cell and Jesus was on the outside talking to me; in his hand he had a key. I asked him what the key was for and he said, it is to open the cell door and when I do, I want you to walk out and leave all the things that come between us in there. He said I want you to walk side by side with me; I want to have a relationship with you that will be more than a conversation. I want you to be the person I made you to be and I will show you

how to be that person; I will be right next to you the whole journey. I saw myself walk out and walk right into Jesus' embrace; I saw myself as a confident person who was about to go on a journey into unknown territory, but I had the best guide I could have.

My life changed that day and I have not gone back to the old Dawn. When Jesus says I need you to do this, I say 'Yes, Lord' I then allow Him to show me how to be that person. In the past 8 years I have made so many changes to who I am, that I don't recognize the old me; she no longer exists. Since my walk I have been a Youth Leader, which required that I did a devotional at least once a month, I have done at least four Fourth Day talks, I was asked to give the sermon at our Church in Texas and I did. I was on the Emmaus Board of Directors in Texas and now I am on the Aldersgate BOD, I am a member of the West Coast Cluster Board and recently I was commissioned as a Stephen Minister.

At our Church I have implemented Emmaus Sunday, where we celebrate the new Babe Chicks and promote the next weekend Walk dates, which has been very successful. There have been many, many more things that God has asked of me; He says to me I have confidence in you or I need you to do this. I have not said No to any of them. God had such grand plans for me and I missed out on a lifetime of being the person He made me to be.

I am forever Grateful to my Sponsor for asking me to consider the Walk to Emmaus. I know that Jesus is standing right next to me, holding my hand and giving me his strength and confidence. Do I know how to do all He has asked me to do or have a desire to do all that He has asked me to? Absolutely not, but I know that His confidence in me will give me the courage to attempt and succeed in anything He asks of me.

What I learned on my Pilgrim Walk, that has carried me through these 8+ years of my Fourth Days, is that He will only ask of me what He had intended for me to do. We all were made to do different things.

So, what does your Prison Cell look like? You too can get out, you just need to allow Jesus to open your cell door and follow Him on the path that He has made for you; allowing Him to show you the way. Live your Fourth Days to the fullest; enjoy the Journey and when you look in the mirror at the person God intended you to be, you will see a Happy, Joy filled person.

I now feel honored that He chose me to be His hands and feet. I am thankful that I went on this Walk to Emmaus; it not only changed my life path, it changed who I am today.

I am finally the person God intended me to be.
