A Message from Our Lay Director Karen Janota

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations..." Mt. 28:19

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In Exodus, God hears the cries of the Israelites in Egypt and trains Moses to lead His people out of bondage. None of us claims to be God, but He has entrusted Emmaus Boards to do what we can to help you, the Emmaus Community, fulfill the Great Commission in the Walks to Emmaus. We have heard your "cries in the wilderness."

Over the past few years, we have met financial crises, overcome them, and persevered. We have complied with Upper Room mandates that have caused consternation among us and changed the way we do things. We have met with the Upper Room and understand the "charism" of Emmaus – the power of the gift of transformation that is the work God has begun in each of us on our Fourth Days. We have shown the Directors of Upper Room ministries our camp so that they will understand the differences of a walk in a retreat setting as opposed to one in an urban environment. We have submitted a request for a variance to the UR Handbook to allow us to sing the three songs at Candlelight that have become a part of our Emmaus culture. That request will be heard by the International Advisory Board on Oct. 22 in Nashville. We have gotten permission to have two angels stationed behind the curtains in the conference room to help serve and clean at snack time and to do tasks behind the scenes in that location.

To add to that, we are working on ways to support our angels who work so hard on our walks so that their Fourth Day service is an experience of spiritual growth. We are also working on ways to make the walk more accessible to team members, leadership, and clergy as well as pilgrims. In this economy, we are all hurting and need to find ways to support the continuing of this program without causing hardships in our own families. If you do not have a program for scholarships for pilgrims, I would ask you to start one, and possibly establish one for those who would love to serve but can't afford it. The Board is analyzing the costs of the walk and seeing where we perhaps can make some changes.

Prayerfully consider how your community is operating. Some are doing just fine, meeting monthly and sending team members and pilgrims, participating in other ministries as well. Some have dwindled away to a faithful few, who are working at least one team a year, but who may not be doing some of the other things we absolutely need to have in play. How many of our communities are Gathering once a month? How many have a board comprised of members of the various churches in your area? How many have a Fourth Day celebration for your new Babechicks? How many are reaching out to other churches in your area to introduce them to the Walk to Emmaus? How many are we sponsoring for both Emmaus and Chrysalis?

Prayerfully consider what you are doing in your Fourth Day? So many of you have been working hard at your churches and in other programs that are very important, such as Chrysalis and Kairos. How many of you are meeting in Reunion Groups? These groups are so important to our spiritual development and support in Christian fellowship. What are you doing to grow spiritually beyond your reunion group?

Change is inevitable. We can fight it or we can deal with it. But Jesus has asked us to persevere. In Hebrews 10, beginning with verse 32, the author tells us: ³²Remember those earlier days after you had received the light, when you stood your ground in a great contest in the face of suffering. ³³Sometimes you were publicly exposed to insult and persecution; at other times you stood side by side with those who were so treated. ³⁴You sympathized with those in prison and joyfully accepted the confiscation of your property, because you knew that you yourselves had better and lasting possessions.³⁵So do not throw away your confidence; it will be richly rewarded. ³⁶You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what He has promised."

We all can do better. I ask each of you to consider your walk experience and ask God where you can best serve Him. Be open to the Holy Spirit to move you – again! In His service,

We've read the Scriptures but do we always remember the love story that God is weaving us throughout the pages?

I recently took some time to reread the Emmaus story in the Bible but this time, I started by reading Luke 24 from verse 1 instead of verse 13. I find it very interesting that Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary, the mother of James and others who went to the tomb and were reminded by the angels that Jesus was risen just like he, "told you when you were still in Galilee." They go tell the eleven but they don't believe them – even though they had been told by Jesus that He would rise on the third day. Peter then runs to the tomb and only sees burial clothing and "went away, wondering to himself what had happened."

So now we get to the two on the road to Emmaus. They're walking and discussing the recent events when "Jesus himself came up and walked along with them but they were kept from recognizing Him." WE WANT YOUR BODY!!



And your heart and your mind! Aldersgate Chrysalis are starting their preparations for the March 2012 walks NOW! The dates are March 17-19 for the girls, and March 23-25 for the boys. The weekends are held at the ACA Camp Geneva, about five-minute drive from the Warren Willis Youth Camp where the Aldersgate Emmaus weekends are held. We really need the support of the Aldersgate community so we can keep this ministry going!!! How can you help?

1) <u>Start working on your youth and youth leaders</u> (under 25 years old) **NOW**! Talk about Chrysalis, the weekends really aren't that much different than your Emmaus weekend. When I was LD for Aldersgate Emmaus Men's Walk #133, many of the team came from a Chrysalis background and remarked how similar the weekends are. Order pamphlets from Upper Room that you can hand out. They come in packs of 50 and you pay for only shipping/handling. OR contact me or other Aldersgate Chrysalis Board members and we'll come to your church/gathering.

2) **SPONSOR!** We're combining *Flight* (out of 9th grade-12th grade) and *Journey* (graduated high school-24 yrs. old, in college OR working) into <u>one</u> weekend. We've designed it so that *Flight* students will sit at their own tables, as will *Journey* students sit at their own. That way, they have common life experiences/expectations to facilitate <u>amazing</u> table discussions.

3) <u>SPONSOR your youth leader</u>! If under 25 yrs old, sponsor them to the March walks. If over 25, sponsor them to an Emmaus weekend <u>NOW</u>!!! Speaking as a youth director, if I can experience a weekend, I KNOW what happens and would want that for my students. Plus everything is done FOR YOU! The planning is already done, I don't have to come up with anything, all I have to do is fulfill my sponsorship responsibilities (agape and transportation) if I'm not working as a team member.

4) **WORK** the weekend! OK, youth may seem scary, but remember, Christian kids are generally better behaved, don't bite, and WANT to strengthen their relationship with Christ. The weekends essentially are the same as an Emmaus weekend with 3 major differences (a) the talks are shorter, 20-25 minutes; (b) the first two afternoons breaks are at least 90 minutes long, can you say "nappy time" or imagine hanging out at the pool; and (c) poster parties tend to be more creative than Emmaus. Also, Chrysalis weekend responsibilities translate into Emmaus weekend responsibilities. Go to our webpage off the Aldersgate Emmaus website, download the "Team Applications" form, fill it out, and mail it NOW!!!

1 Timothy 4:12 says, "Do not let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching, to teaching." Sponsor several students and help equip them to go back to their high school, college, or work place, armed and fired up to spread God's incredible message! ALL forms can be found on our web page.

Showcasing Jail & Prison Ministries "I was in prison and you came to visit me: Matthew 25:36



After the Mountaintop... (Matthew 34-40) Chuck Bradley, Chair, Kairos of Florida

You have made your walk. The view from the mountaintop was wonderful. You may have even worked several other walks. It was great to see others experience God's Love in such a powerful way and to have been used by Him to bring that about. However, you may still be seeking some other mission to put a focus on how you can continue to serve God beyond Emmaus.

The mission of Kairos Prison Ministry is to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, to impact the hearts and lives of incarcerated men, women and youth, as well as their families, and to become loving and productive citizens of their communities.

Within Kairos, we have three ways to serve. The first is Kairos Inside. In Kairos Inside, a group of ecumenical, lay-led, Christian volunteers enter prisons to conduct a short course in the Christian faith. These volunteers from the communities surrounding an institution present an introductory 3day weekend, very similar to an Emmaus weekend. This inter-denominational team of volunteers both clergy and laypersons — work in cooperation with the Chaplain who carefully selects up to 42 inmate leaders to attend. A well-organized follow up program is part of this ministry. This follow up program is the heart of the ministry and is designed to build a Christian community within the prisons to change the prison environment.

Ministry

Residents Encounter Christ (REC) is an interdenominational Christian ministry that brings the Good News of God's grace to residents of jails in Florida.

Mission Statement

Our one essential belief is that everyone in the world needs a relationship with Jesus Christ. Everything - **everything** else is non-essential. God has called us to help bring that essential belief to the residents of jails in Florida.

What is an REC Weekend?

During a three day REC experience, a team of about 35-45 Christian men and women from different denominational backgrounds, both lay and clergy, enter a correctional facility to share 3-days of Christian community. Through a series of talks and group discussions, we teach priorities, goalsetting, and encourage a strong faith as a way of life for their future.

Each of the 3 days of the weekend has a separate theme that are:

- "Die Day" centered on the death of Jesus Christ and how in our dying to self we become alive in Christ.
- "Rise Day" a joyous celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- "Go Day" explores the continuous call to spread the Good News.

The second way you can get involved in Kairos is through Kairos Torch for Youthful Offenders. This program ministers to incarcerated youths from ages 17 -22. These individuals frequently come from broken homes where they did not have good role models to lead and inspire them. Kairos Torch offers unconditional love and acceptance, encouraging young men and women to share their life journey through participation in a long term mentoring process. The program begins with a weekend retreat inside the prison. This retreat is similar to the Emmaus walk but is geared to a younger generation and is focused on having the participants put aside the "masks" they use to hide their emotions and feelings. Each team member pairs with a specific resident and mentors that individual through a guided program over a six-month period. Kairos Torch offers the opportunity for husband/wife teams to work together on a team as mentors to these incarcerated youth as the teams going into the facility are co-ed.

The third branch of the Kairos Ministry is Kairos Outside. Kairos Outside is a special weekend retreat designed to support the female loved ones of men and women who are or were incarcerated. Families of the incarcerated "do time" right along with their loved ones .Often, they bear the shame of having a loved one in prison. In some Christian communities, when a family member goes to prison those left behind become ostracized and unwelcomed. Kairos Outside provides a safe environment with loving people where these women interact with other women who are in similar situations and learn to form small groups to support and give themselves the strength for the challenges they face. They learn that they are "Not Alone." They learn that God has not abandoned them and that they are loved by Jesus and by his followers here on earth. The team members for Kairos Outside are primarily women but male "angels" who get things done behind the scenes on the weekend support them.

Within Florida, there are currently 34 prisons with active Kairos inside programs and we are starting the process of entering three more prisons. We have four Kairos Outside programs throughout the state and two Kairos Torch programs. We are hoping to start more Kairos Torch programs but we need volunteers with a heart for mentoring at-risk youth.

In his book, "Experiencing God," Henry Blackabee stated, "If you don't know what plans God has for your life, find out where He is working and join Him there." I can assure you that He is working mightily in the prisons and in the families of the incarcerated. While we do not serve in Kairos for what it does FOR US, it is impossible not to be transformed by God's Love. When we go to prisons, we are trying to love those who society has determined as being "bad" or "worthless." That is the same as when Jesus loved us and gave His life for us while we were yet "sinners." When you try (as best we can as fallible humans) to love as God loves, you cannot help but become more like Him!

Volunteers

Volunteers are the most important resource communities have and they are the heart of our REC program. Without them we could not do God's work in Florida jails.

Those serving on an REC team must have participated in a Cursillo, Emmaus, Discipleship, Tres Dias, or similar "Walk" experience.

Serving as a REC volunteer typically means that you will be assigned to serve with a team of other volunteers who come together to hold an REC weekend at a Florida jail. The team is formed and trained over several sessions prior to an REC weekend. Roles may include serving as a table leader, speaker, musician, or as inside and/or outside jail support members.




