

Meet the Board: **Bonnie Wendell**


An avowed Emmaus junkie, Bonnie is serving as the representative for Seminole County and as the Emmaus Registrar.

wonderful walk.



The promise of new spaces excites us and all who use the facilities. Just wait until the October Walks when we get to try them out. In the meantime, watch your step.

"Sponsorship: The Most Important Job in Emmaus"

Nashville Upper Room Staff reiterates the importance of Responsible Sponsorship



Just a quick reminder of your responsibilities as a Sponsor.

YOU, not a friend, should bring your Pilgrim to the send-off. Please be sure to wear your name tag but NOT your cross to Sendoff. Be sure you plan to stay after the Pilgrims leave for the Sponsor Hour. This is very important as it is the time to take communion with the community and pray for the Pilgrims. Especially important is for you to pray over their crosses. Registration begins at 7:00 pm and continues until all pilgrims are accounted for.

Candlelight and closing are also very special moments remembered by your Pilgrim. Please be sure to attend **BOTH SERVICES**. Your presence will bless them beyond measure.

Candlelight begins at 8 pm and Brown Bag supper begins at 7pm. Closing begins at 4 pm. Usually you can load your pilgrims gear from the porch in Barnett Lodge then gather on the back porch until the angels give you the signal to move to the Chapel.

Don't forget to start collecting their "Agape Letters." NOW! A head start allows time for "out of state" letters to arrive. and for your own peace of mind. Please be sure both first and last names are on each envelope and you have marked in the upper left corner if they are from family. It is important that these are the first letters your pilgrim receives. These are to be brought to Candlelight on Saturday night and there will be a box there for you to put them in. Be sure they are bundled together with the Pilgrims name on them and

be sure you do not have any more than 12 letters PUT FROM SPOUSE, CHILD, PARENT MINISTER on the outside of the letter so that will ensure that that letter will definitely be part of the 12 to go into their agape bags. Any extras you are to keep and give to your Pilgrim after closing. The reason for this is that we don't want someone getting a big stack and someone else just a few. No gifts are to be given with the letters. These also should be saved for after Closing. <u>Under no</u> circumstances should you bring the letters to Send Off with you. There is too much risk that the Pilgrims will see them and the surprise will be spoiled.

Additionally, sponsors should offer to help the spouse during the weekend as needed. Prepare your Pilgrim with the proper things they will need to bring to the camp. I.E bedding, comfortable clothing,

closed toe shoes, medications, towel

Please be very careful not to tell your Pilgrim too much. Let the surprises happen for them. They should always be sweet memories for them.

When mailing in the Sponsor sheet and Reservation form for the walk- please remember that email address are extremely important. Also, write legibly so that the information can be read. List any special needs of the Pilgrim- such as dietary- physical- lower bunk A SEPARATE CHECK FOR EACH APPLICATION. Do not send a combined check for husband and wife.

If you are sponsoring 1 person of a couple and the spouse is not going to do the walk you must review the EQUAL COMMIT-MENT RULES that are on the Aldersgate Website and submit the letter with

the application.

Any help you can offer in cleaning up after the walk would be greatly appreciated by the team. We have worked hard and we are tired by the end of Sunday. The community can come in around 3:30, before the closing ceremony and help vacuum, empty trash, wipe down bathrooms, and empty the

Your help in proper Sponsoring will greatly help the team make this an unforgettable experience for your Pilgrim

kitchen.

30 days prior to the walk your pilgrim will receive a confirmation letter. This is sent by email. Please follow up with your pilgrim around this time frame to be sure the confirmation letter has been received and address any questions or concerns your pilgrim may have. My name, phone numbers and email address

are also on this confirmation letter and they can also contact me for any help needed.

If you, as a sponsor, have any questions regarding the responsibility of a sponsor, please feel free to contact me to discuss. If it has been a while since you sponsored some changes may have been made as a result of the Upper Room contract.



ne of the require-ments of serving on the Board is to attend a training session provided by the Upper Room.

On February 25, Carolyn Shields, Robin Andras, Bonnie Wendell, Mike Kutik, Joline Krolicki, Don Tesenair, and Jo Ann Martin went to Lakeland for training and met with Emmaus Boards from communities all over the Southeast area of the United States.

The information was practical, the jokes were keepers, the fellowship was incredible, and the sense of the

Spirit was evident.

Perhaps the most impactful moment of the gathering occurred in the afternoon. Having been made aware of a need in Zambia, the community responded in an amazing way.

We had received a letter asking for assistance in order to send pilgrims on a Walk to Emmaus in South Africa for the purpose of beginning a community in Zambia. The total cost was to be in excess of \$6,000. The Upper Room had already pledged over one third of the money

when the offering was taken.

The approximately 150 – 200 Board members at that session contributed an additional \$2200!

When the total was announced, the Spirit moved and a Board from the West Coast of Florida quickly gathered, prayed, and donated the remaining amount!

As a result, the Walk to Emmaus soon will have an operating community in Zambia, Africa, offering walks for their neighbors and friends in Christ.

BY LAWS of the ALDERSGATE EMMAUS, INC. as revised on February 21, 2012

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this community shall be Aldersgate Emmaus, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Community.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

Section 1. The object of the Community shall be to inspire, challenge, and equip Church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, places of work, and the world community through the Emmaus experience.

Section 2. The Community is affiliated with the International Emmaus Program of the Upper Room Ministries, Nashville, Tennessee.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. All persons who have completed a weekend experience of the Walk to Emmaus sponsored by an Upper Room Emmaus Community shall be members of the Community.

Section 2. Persons who have completed a three-day short course in Christianity (i.e., Walk to Emmaus, Chrysalis, Cursillo, Tres Dias, L.I.F.E., Kairos or Kairos Outside weekend, etc.) may become members by: participating in the activities of the Aldersgate Community,

asking the secretary of the Community to include their names in the mailing list, or registering on the website (www.aldersgateemmaus.org)

ARTICLE IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Purpose

Direction of the Community shall be vested in Board of Directors, hereinafter referred to as the Board.

Section 2. Composition

The Board will consist of lay members elected by their local areas within the Aldersgate Community. There may also be nonvoting members and ex-officio members as deemed necessary by the Board (i.e. trailer supplies & care, webmaster).

The Board will select three clergy as spiritual directors. They shall be full voting members of the Board.

Section 3. Terms of Office

Laypersons on the Board shall be elected by their geographical areas for a three (3) year term.

Board Members cannot succeed themselves in consecutive terms, a term being three (3) years.

Terms of office shall begin January 1 and shall terminate December 31, except in cases of extenuating circumstances such as illness as determined by the Board.

Clergy shall serve as Spiritual Directors for three (3) years.

The immediate past Chair of the Board shall serve on the Board as a <u>non-voting</u> member one (1) additional year, or the normal period of the term, whichever is longer.

Section 4. Election of Board Members

Retiring Board members shall be responsible for assisting in the selection of a replacement from their community. The local community election process should be done no later than their September Gathering. The new replacement Board member will come to the November Board meeting along with the current Board member and be presented to the Board. He/she will take office Jan. 1 and be at the first Board meeting in January.

The board may elect persons, upon nomination by the community or chair, to fill a vacant term until the next regular election for that term. Such persons are eligible for election to a full term by the Community at such regular election.

Article V. OFFICERS OF THE BOARD

Section 1. Officers

Officers shall be Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, and Secretary, and in case of absence, meetings will be chaired in this order.

The Treasurer and Spiritual Director shall be elected officers that will not chair meetings.

The immediate past Chair of the Board shall serve on the Board one (1) additional year, or the normal period of the term, whichever is longer.

The Board Chair is also called the Community Lay Directorr. Section 2. Election of Officers

A Nominating Committee, consisting of retiring members of the Board, will be appointed by the Chair at the first Board meeting. The Nominating committee shall recommend a slate of officers for the following year.

The slate of officers shall be presented by this committee at the November Board meeting. Nominations may also be made from the floor.

The new officers shall be elected for one-year-terms by a majority vote of the Board at the November

meeting.

Section 3. Spiritual Director

The Board of Directors shall select a Community Spiritual Director annually from the three clergy members of the Board. The term of office shall begin January 1 and end December 31.

The Community Spiritual Director may be replaced during the term by a majority of affirmative votes.

ARTICLE VI. MEETINGS

Section 1. Schedule

The regular Board meeting shall be every odd month on the third Saturday of the month in a central location, unless otherwise ordered by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board in a regular meeting. The third Saturday of April will be an extra meeting held annually in a central location or by video conferencing when feasible to select Leadership for the Walks for the following year.

Section 2. Quorum

A majority of members of the current Board of Directors must be present at a duly called meeting to constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Special Meetings

A special Board meeting may be called by the Chairperson, in writing, by a majority of the Board present. Special meetings may also be called electronically.

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

Section 1. At the first meeting of the year, the Board of Directors shall name Board members to chair the following committees: Registration, Team Selection, Newsletter, Music, Librarian, Leadership Training, Agape, and others as deemed necessary.

Section 2. The Chairperson of the Board will be ex-officio member of all standing committees.

ARTICLE VIII. WALK TO EMMAUS

Section 1. The Community shall follow the guidelines of The Upper Room Walk to Emmaus program in

- the formation of the three-day (72 hour) experience "Walk to Emmaus".
- Section 2 The Board of Directors shall have general oversight in all matters relating to the Community Walks to Emmaus.
- Section 3 In April of each year, the Board of Directors shall choose Lay Leadership for each Community Walk to Emmaus weekend.
- Section 4 The Spiritual Directors of each Community Walk to Emmaus shall be selected by the Board.
- Section 5. The Board shall <u>establish</u> a Team Selection Committee. The Team Selection Committee shall consist of a Board member who serves as the Chair, the Community Spiritual Director, and three (3) or four (4) members of the Emmaus Community who have a broad awareness of the community membership. The Board will make recommendations at the April Board meeting for qualified persons to serve as Assistant Lay Directors and Outside Coordinators.

ARTICLE IX. AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

- Section 1. Proposed amendments may be presented to the Board by any member of the Community one (1) month in advance of consideration.
- Section 2. If the amendments are voted in the affirmative by a three-fourths (3/4) vote of the Board, they will be circulated to the membership through their Board Representative and the Community newsletter. If no petitions signed by at least twenty-five (25) community members objecting to the new amendments are received, the amendments will be considered adopted. Any specific objection(s) must be received within sixty (60) days of the mailing of the notification. If an objection petition is received, the amendment will be considered voided.
- Section 3. If the Board then wishes to submit the amendment to the entire Community for a vote, it may do so. A majority of votes cast by the membership will decide the matter.

ARTICLE X. RATIFICATION

The Bylaws are to take effect immediately upon certification by the Board.

NOTE: Changes are underlined. If there is no objection from the Community, the By-Laws will take effect in 60 days.
