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A CALL TO CHRISTIAN ACTION: SPONSORSHIP & TEAMS



A Message from Our Lay Director Karen Janota

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

It's hot! The middle of summer is not a time to think of DOING much of anything that doesn't call for water or air conditioning. Remember how cool it can get at night in the bunk rooms at camp? Remember how much fun you had on your walk? Remember how much you learned?

Isn't it time you sponsored someone to go on his or her Walk? Even better, how about serving on a team? We still need men for October, and we need women for January. Then we will need both men and women for March.

West Orange Board Rep. Joline Krolicki would love to come to your community Gathering to speak to your group regarding sponsoring. She has taken on that responsibility and has developed a sponsorship booklet that she will share with you. Sponsorship involves more than just gathering letters and delivering your pilgrim. Sponsorship means preparing your pilgrim for the journey. It means discussing his/her daily life and finding out how you can help while he/she is away. Can you feed the cat, take the kids to the park for the afternoon, help with laundry? In some communities, sponsors even pay for their pilgrims, or offer to pay half. Our tradition in Citrus is to take pilgrims to dinner on the way to camp and again on the way home, or to have a dinner at church first and go from there.

Another beautiful way to honor our pilgrims is to make agape for pillow or table. This is something that can be done by individuals or reunion groups. The minimum number of pieces of agape is 70. Also, posters from your community signed by your members at a Gathering become wall agape. PLEASE, do not bring letters or agape in with your pilgrim at send-off. Wait until the pilgrims leave, then bring them in. The agape angel will take them at that time. Remember that only 12 letters are allowed for each pilgrim and no gifts. If you collect more letters and gifts (and we hope you do), save them for the ride home on Sunday.

Pray also about serving on a team. We need team members in all positions other than leadership. We need leadership for next October 2012. If you are a Babe-chick, chances are your first team experience will be as an angel or an assistant table leader. If you have served in the past, you know what to expect. This is a way for you to give back to our community and should be part of your Fourth Day service. If you have mobility issues, don't forget the golf carts! Please go online and fill out the form as soon as possible. www.aldersgateemmaus.org.

Don't forget that we also have a Chrysalis community that is getting ready for their Flight/Journey in October as well. Here's another opportunity to serve and to sponsor! See that information elsewhere in the newsletter.

Over 8000 people have attended the Walk to Emmaus since we started in 1980. Some have gone to be with Jesus. Some have moved away. Some have been unhappy with the Upper Room mandates. Some have changed the direction of their service to Kairos and other outreach services, all of which are very important to God's work in the world. But don't forget Emmaus. We still need you too. Consider making it an annual event to serve on a team. Remember, we rely on God, and He is relying on us.

Special Report Aldersgate Board Meeting With the Upper Room

Special Message from the Chairperson

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Your Emmaus Board and Chrysalis Board representatives recently met with the International Lay Director, Greg Engroff, our Southeastern Representative Fred Watson, and Chrysalis Representative David McKeown at Warren Willis Camp in Fruitland Park. We asked them to meet with us so that all of us could hear the same thing regarding mandated changes from the Upper Room. We also presented our concerns and had a spirited discussion that resulted in the following points.

First, these gentlemen don't make the decisions. We have an International Advisory Committee that meets in Nashville in October. We will be presenting in writing the changes we would like to see made flexible, such as the inclusion of angels in all of team training, the singing of songs at Candlelight, and perhaps another issue or two.

In addition, we discovered that most other communities do not use outside support as we do. In fact, Greg stated that most communities have 50 - 150 of what we call angels that come in for one meal to cook, serve, and clean up. By our very nature, our inclusion of "outside support" has to be different. So in order to overcome the perception that the outside team is not part of the team, we are working to develop a program so that the ASD will be working with the outside team to provide devotions, communion, and perhaps some other activities.

Greg presented a PowerPoint entitled the Charism of Emmaus. Charism is a divine gift. When we hold a Walk to Emmaus, we are sharing that gift with our pilgrims. It might be a gift that changes their lives, as it has for all of us. And the most important part is that those pilgrims share that gift with others in their Fourth Days. It is the Great Commission that we go out and make disciples. Whether the Walk to Emmaus is the same as it used to be, or whether it changes to meet the needs of the time, isn't the reason we're involved the same? We want to make disciples for Christ or renew those who have become disheartened. We want to be vessels through which the Holy Spirit can work. The Walk to Emmaus is one way we can do that.

I pray that you will search your heart and find the willingness to continue to serve on teams and sponsor pilgrims.

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Showcasing Sponsorship

In order to sponsor someone on Walk to Emmaus, a person must first have been on The Walk itself. A sponsor should also be active in Fourth Day. Having been through the experience and being engaged in ongoing spiritual formation through Fourth Day gives one perspective on how to sponsor.

The basic attitude of a sponsor is one of prayerful discernment. This results in intentional acts of unconditional love, or what is often termed ""the first act of agapé."

For further help, a great resource is the Emmaus Library Series booklet, *Sponsorship*, by Richard and Janine Gilmore. The following is an excerpt:

"Sponsorship can be unwise or wise. Unwise sponsorship results from unbridled enthusiasm that wants everyone to have the same experience. Sponsors with unbridled enthusiasm approach anybody and everybody with the admonition that "you need to go on The Walk,"



and that open invitation is the primary (sometimes the only) emphasis. This approach lacks discernment and will result in a burden for the church. Such efforts in sponsorship frequently result in religious fringe groups within the church or possibly a parachurch of "Emmausites." While the individual being sponsored may benefit, that individual does not go back into the church to foster growth and renewal. The lack of commitment at this point is contrary to the purpose of Emmaus.

Wise sponsorship is careful, intentional, prayerful, and purposeful because it results from God's leading. The pilgrims return to their churches and community renewed in their commitment to be effective disciples."

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Grow Through Study An Opportunity for Spiritual Growth

Spiritual Formation Academy at LEC

The first ever Multilingual Two Year Academy for Spiritual Formation held its first session July 26 - 31 at the LEC in Fruitland Park. For those who are not familiar with the LEC, it's right across the road from Warren Willis Camp where we make our Walks.

When you made your Walk to Emmaus, you started a journey along a path to spiritual formation. Many people don't move beyond that in a formal path to spiritual development because we get busy in our churches and in our communities and perhaps don't even know these opportunities are available. And like Emmaus, they aren't for everybody.

The Upper Room offers a series of studies called Companions in Christ. Although there is a 32-week course, many of us prefer short doses of study at a time. These are different from courses like Disciple, which is a great way to deepen your knowledge of the Bible. These courses are targeted toward spiritual practices, such as The Way of Prayer.

If this appeals to you, you might want to attend a weekend gathering at the LEC. A recent gathering dealt with dying banners for dressing up your worship or prayer areas. Those banners may show up in the prayer rooms at annual conference, or next year at General Conference, when Methodists from all over the world gather in Tampa.

I attended a gathering that focused on prayer. We prayed with artwork, icons, beaded bracelets that we made. We walked the labyrinth, did body prayers and learned ways to center ourselves for prayer.

If you want more than that, the Conference sponsors 5-Day Academies that focus on one topic for a week. The week follows a rhythm such as one would find in a monastery, involving times of prayer, listening to the presenters, reflecting in silence, response, and worship. Oh, yes, the food is great too! Participants form covenant groups that share their reactions, prayer requests, etc.

The Two-Year Academy for Spiritual Formation is another leap forward. Participants are given a booklist for each session. They meet once a quarter at the LEC and resume the same rhythm as the 5-Day, with silence, prayer, presentations, etc. It is in-depth and is geared toward increasing one's understanding of and development of spirituality.

As I am writing this, I just got back from the first session. Besides Floridians, we had people from all over the country as well as St. Martin, Puerto Rico, and Canada. Our presenters were Dr. Juan Bek from Puerto Rico and Dr. Wendy Wright from Creighton University in Nebraska. Dr. Bek's lectures were in Spanish, translated by two members of our group. Dr. Wright's were in English. Worship was in both languages.

One presenter lectures in the morning, one in the afternoon. Each lecture is followed by a question about which we are asked to pray and meditate on in silence. Then we come back for sharing, questions and discussion. There is plenty of other time for sharing and getting to know each other at meals and in covenant groups.

Worship is also in both languages at this academy. The leaders provided homilies with translation, and we sang, prayed, and responded in both languages. We took communion with fresh bread each day, baked in our kitchen.

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The first session, the emphasis was in getting to know what spirituality is. Juan Bek's topic was "Attentiveness to the Word: Spiritual Formation and Scripture". He introduced us to several themes that reside within the Word, and gave us some different ways of looking at some familiar verses and stories within the Bible. Our required reading included THE RETURN OF THE PRODIGAL SON by Henri Nouwen and TWELVE STEPS TO INNER FREEDOM: HUMILITY REVISITED by Joan Chittister.

Wendy Wright gave us an introduction to Western Christian Spirituality, showing us movements through history and how we still use some beliefs and practices centuries later, and why some of those had to change. Our text for that was A BRIEF HISTORY OF SPIRITUALITY by Sheldrake and FRANCIS OF ASSISI: PERFORMING THE GOSPEL LIFE by Lawrence Cunningham.

Sound like a graduate course? Sort of... but with no tests or grades. You can get continuing education credits for FL Conference if you're Methodist and other CEU's are available for other denominations through the Upper Room. The credits do not cross over to Lay Servant Certification, however, at this time. (They should!)

Remember, this is an ecumenical movement and you do not have to be a Methodist to attend. Likewise, even though most have gone through Emmaus, that is not a requirement. There are as many pastors as lay persons, but most do not use their titles.

If it sounds like something you would be interested in, go to the Upper Room website and look for Academy links. It is expensive, but not as expensive as going for a graduate degree. It is well worth it. There are still openings for this academy if you can attend all the rest of the sessions, the next being October 24 – 29. If you are interested, contact one of the leaders or apply online as soon as possible. The leaders in our area include Rev. Cathy Thacker who is our theological leader and Lucy Wray, our hospitality coordinator. Other leaders include Johnny Sears and Rev. Victor Perez from Nashville, Rev. Irving Cotto from PA and Catherine Long from LA. Rev. Victor just retired as International Spiritual Director of Emmaus and Chrysalis at the end of June.

As I end this, I pray that you consider growing in Christ in one of these ways. Just as your Fourth Day takes you from camp into the world, whether it's a weekend or a week or 8 weeks over two years, Spiritual Formation can give you a chance to retreat and renew. It gives one a taste of the monastic life, with a rhythm all its own. Are you ready for something more?

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You can now volunteer to serve for any part of a men's or women's Walk to Emmaus team as a temporary member of the outside Angel squad. No need to participate in any team meetings and you are not required to spend the night in the bunkhouse. Just call the Outside Coordinator prior to the start of the Walk and let him or her know when you will arrive and how long you will plan to stay.

The cost to be a Day-Angel is only: \$6.00 (Camp Fee). If desired, the cost for meals is: Breakfast \$7.00, Lunch \$8.00, Dinner \$11.00

INFORMATION FOR SPONSORS:

Sponsors, please bring your Pilgrim's agapé letters on Thursday night of the Walk at the send-off and give them to a member of the team. Limit the number of letters to be given to your Pilgrim(s) on Sunday afternoon to no more than 12. These should be letters from those closest to the Pilgrim(s) starting with immediate family members. Additional agapé letters from friends and other church members may be provided following the weekend.



Also, to avoid name mix-ups, a reminder that the proper way to address agapé letters is to write the Pilgrim's full name on the envelope. In the return address location write the relationship of the author (family, friend, pastor, sponsor). This act of agapé on your part will be greatly appreciated by someone trying to sort through letters on Saturday night. Please remember personal gifts should be given to the pilgrim after the weekend and not included in the agapé letters.




